Xi, Putin hint at settlement to end Ukraine war

Both sides believe that for "a sustainable settlement of the Ukrainian crisis, it is necessary to eliminate its root causes.

BEIJING, May 16: Chinese President Xi Jinping on Thursday hinted at a political settlement to end the Ukraine war, saying he expects peace and stability will return to the European continent, shortly after his talks with Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin as the two leaders vowed to counter any attempt by the US to hinder their strategic ties.

Putin received a grand welcome upon his arrival here earlier in the day on his first foreign visit after winning the fifth term in office in March for wide-ranging talks with Xi

to reset the burgeoning China-Russia strategic ties for the

"China hopes that peace and stability will return to the European continent at an early date, and stands ready to play a constructive role to this end," Xi said at a joint press conference with Putin after their talks. A joint statement issued af-

ter Putin-Xi talks said that both sides believe that for "a sustainable settlement of the Ukrainian crisis, it is necessary to eliminate its root causes."

In a veiled criticism of the US, which is pressuring Beijing to end its strategic ties with

Russia, the joint statement said relations between China and Russia do not target any third countries, therefore they will counter any attempts to hinder such cooperation.

"The two sides note that the relationship between Russia and China has progressed to a more advanced interstate cooperation compared to the military-political unions of the Cold War era as it is not bloc or confrontational in nature, nor does it target any third countries," Russia's new agency Tass quoted the document as saying.

Protest over Centre's move to fence India-Myanmar border

Organisation of Mizo tribes warns of 1966 revolt redux

AIZAWL, May 16: The Zo Reunification Organisation (ZoRO), serving as the voice for ethnic Mizo tribes across Myanmar, India and Bangladesh, has issued a stern caution to the Central government, evoking memories of the tumultuous 1966 revolt in Mizoram.

Speaking at a massive rally, peacefully staged at the Mizoram-Myanmar border village of Zokhawthar in Champhai district on Thursday, ZoRO general secretary L Ramdinliana Renthlei conveyed a grave message.

He warned that should the Central government persist with its plans to erect a border fence and discard the Free Movement Regime (FMR), the youths might be left with no recourse but to take up arms once more, in reference to the Mizos Uprising of 1966 when Mizo youths led by Laldenga waged war against India.

Renthlei lamented the Central government's obstinacy in the face of vehement opposition from the Mizos.

Echoing Renthlei's sentiments, ZoRO president R Sangkawia attributed nefarious intentions to certain entities seeking to fracture the unity of the 'Zofate' - the ethnic Mizo community. Sangkawia emphasised the inherent unity of the Zofate across geographical boundaries, emphasizing that a nation transcends physical demarcations.

Further strengthening Zo-RO's stance, adviser to Chief Minister Lalmuanpuia Punte, also vice president of ZoRO, underscored the indivisibility of communities straddling the Mizoram-Myanmar border. Punte categorically rejected the boundaries imposed by the British colonial rulers and criticised the Indian government's acquiescence to such delineations. He highlighted the Mizoram Legislative Assembly's resolution opposing border fencing and the abandonment of the FMR.

Bangladesh top destination for medical studies

GUWAHATI, May 16: medical Bangladesh has become one of the top destinations for budding doctors from Assam and other parts of the Northeast, with nearly 400 students securing 'Student Visas' in the past five years. The Assistant High Commissioner of Bangladesh in Guwahati revealed that in the last academic year alone, over 100 students were issued student visas.

This shift in educational migration patterns is attributed to factors such as ease of admission, quality of education, and notably, the affordability of tuition fees.

According to Ruhul Amin, Assistant High Commissioner of Bangladesh in Guwahati, the cost of medical education in Bangladesh, averaging around Rs 30 lakh for a fiveyear course, is significantly lower compared to Indian private medical colleges, rendering Bangladesh an attractive option for aspiring doctors.

ture, and geographical proximity further enhance Bangladesh's appeal.

Amin informed that Bangladesh has 37 government medical colleges and 72 private colleges, offering ample opportunities for medical education. The 72 private medical colleges of Bangladesh have over 6,500 seats.

Nearly, 12,000 Indian students are currently studying

of Bangladesh and the number continues to be on the rise. The Bangladesh Government, in the year 2022, has slashed the foreign student quota by 5 per cent to allow more local students to be admitted to the colleges.

Following this, the Bangladesh Private Medical College Association has recently asked the Government to roll back the quota to 50 per cent given the economic benefits.

"As Bangladesh continues to emerge as a premier educational hub, the trend of Assamese students pursuing medical studies across the border is expected to continue, reshaping the landscape of medical education in the region," opined a senior physician of Gauhati Medical College and Hospital.

Director of Medical Education, Assam, Dr Anup Barman said that the private medical colleges of Bangladesh have largely succeeded in catering to hopes of the middle-class family.

GUWAHATI, May 16: The Assam Government is planning to set up new model schools under the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) to provide quality education to the students of the interior areas of the

The chairman of the Adarsha Vidyalaya Sangathan, Dr Nani Gopal Mahanta told The Assam Tribune that at present, 56 model schools are

areas of the State and the aim is to establish new schools to increase the number of model schools to 126.

Replying to a question as to why the Government decided to establish model schools under the CBSE by overlooking the State boards, Mahanta pointed out that most of the parents prefer the CBSE and that is why, private schools are flourishing in Assam. He said that the model schools of the State Government take a minimum fee

is much lower than the fees charged by the private schools. He said that after the establishment of the model schools, many parents shifted their wards from private schools to the Government model schools and in fact, several private schools have al-

ready closed down. Mahanta said that the students of the model schools are performing well and this year, the pass percentage was over 96 per cent.

Behali reserve forest

BEHALI (Biswanath), May 16: The failure of the State government to settle nagging boundary disputes with Arunachal Pradesh has triggered widespread destruction of Assam forests along the border. The biodiversity-rich Behali reserve forest (RF) in Biswanath district straddling the Assam-Arunachal border exemplifies best how the Assam government's inertia has bled the pristine forest.

The State government had issued a notification (preliminary) for declaring Behali RF as a wildlife sanctuary, fulfilling a long-standing demand of conservation circles and raising hopes for its long-term

A gazette notification published on May 4, 2022, recognised an area of 157.25 sq km under Borgang Forest Range in Sonitpur East Forest Division in Biswanath district as Behali Wildlife Sanctuary.

The sanctuary area comprises mostly the 140-sq km Behali RF besides Chenglijan RF. However, a sizeable section of the forest has been under encroachment from Arunachal Pradesh, and more worryingly, the ongoing organised encroachment has intensified in recent times.

While the failure to settle the boundary row has put a dampener on the proposed wildlife sanctuary status for Behali, forest department sources told The Assam Tribune that only a small northern stretch is plagued by a genuine border dispute and the rest of the area under encroachment actually falls under Assam.

TAMLUK (WB), May 16: A day after announcing that she would extend outside support to the Opposition front INDIA after it comes to power, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee today said that she is very much part of the anti-BJP alliance at the national level and would continue to be in it.

While addressing an election rally at Tamluk, Banerjee said that the TMC is not in alliance with the CPI(M) and the Congress in West Bengal.

"At the all-India level, some people have misunderstood my statement yesterday. I am very much part of the INDIA alliance. The IN-DIA alliance was my brainchild. We are together at the national level and will continue to be together," she said. Banerjee alleged that the

West Bengal units of both CPI(M) and Congress, who are part of the INDIA alliance, have joined hands and helped the BJP in the State.

"Do not count on the CPI(M) and the Congress in Bengal. They are not with us, they are with the BJP here. I am talking about that (INDIA bloc) in Delhi," she said.

Banerjee on Wednesday said her party will extend support to the Opposition IN-DIA bloc from outside to form the government at the Centre. Expressing scepticism about the BJP's ambitious target of achieving 400 seats in the Lok Sabha elections, she said that people will reject them.

"The entire country has understood that the BJP is a party full of thieves. We (TMC) will support the IN-DIA bloc from outside to form a government at the Centre. We will extend our support so that in Bengal, our mothers and sisters never face a problem... And those who work in the 100 days' job scheme, also do not face problems," Banerjee had

The TMC had walked out of the INDIA bloc in West Bengal in January but asserted that she would continue to be part of the Opposition bloc at the national level.

The TMC supremo was addressing a rally in Tamluk, under which comes the Nandigram Assembly constituency from where she had lost to the BJP in the 2021 State polls.

Today she vowed to avenge the defeat as she asserted that the poll results didn't reflect the people's mandate. Banerjee said, "The BIP

won by disconnecting power supply at the counting centre on the day of counting on May 2, 2021."

"The mandate was stolen by the BJP through unscrupulous means. They disconnect the power supply at the counting centre. I had moved court against it. But either today or tomorrow, I will avenge my defeat," she said.

The anti-land acquisition movement in Nandigram in 2007 against the then Left Front government was instrumental in the Mamata Baneriee-led Trinamool Congress' rise to power in 2011 in Bengal. – PTI

Menstrual abnormalities were noticed in 4.6 per cent of female participants. Ocular abnormalities and

hypothyroidism were observed in 2.7 per cent and 0.6 per cent of participants. Four deaths (three female individuals, and one male individual) were reported in adults, the study added. All four had diabetes, hypertension in three, and a history of prevaccination Covid-19 was

present in two of them. Stroke was the main contributor to two deaths and one fatality was due to post-Covid-19 rhinocerebral mucormycosis, which supposedly disseminated after vaccination as

reported by the caregivers. The fourth death happened in a woman with multiple

post-vaccination, the aetiology of which remained unidentified till death. In the absence of a definite causality association, no conclusions can be drawn from these events, the study said.

"Interestingly, adults receiving three doses and those receiving one dose of BBV152 were respectively at four and two times higher risk of AESIs compared with adults receiving two doses of the Covaxin," the study said. A booster dose mechanistically enhances the production of anti-Spike antibodies above that produced by the second dose. Significant cross-reactivity has been shown between anti-SARS-CoV-2 antibodies and diverse human antigens and this can explain

"Pending a final settlement of the boundary dispute, the State government can declare the rest of the forest as a wildlife sanctuary leaving the small disputed stretch. Dilly-dallying with the matter will only encourage further encroachment," sources added.

Nature's Bonyapran, an NGO which has documented the flora and fauna of Behali RF, asserts that a resolution to the dispute should have the Survey of India map as the basis.

"There has to be a giveand-take approach with Arunachal Pradesh. The Assam government can consider leaving a 1.5-km stretch (from the Arunachal border) from the east of Tarachu river up to Bihmari/Buroi and bringing inside the sanctuary an equal area towards the north of Dikal-Radhachu. This will ensure that the sanctuary area remains the same," Sankar Dutta, secretary general of the

NGO said.

The NGO, which has also moved Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on the issue, further reasoned that some Arunachali families occupying the forest at Lower Tarachu, Kachubil, Townbil and Bormai can be rehabilitated on the north of Behali near the lower Arunachal side.

"While the areas under encroachment are big, the population of the encroachers is rather small and those can easily be relocated in some available open areas. We can settle the boundary dispute through a give-and-take approach even without compromising on the overall integri-

ty of Behali RF," Dutta said. The NGO, in its memo to the Chief Minister, stressed that with the effects of climate change now starting to manifest, conservation of Behali in its entirety assumes tremendous significance.

"Behali falls in a global biodiversity hotspot and is also a prime elephant habitat. Its remarkable faunal and floral diversity apart, its strategic location linking it with Kaziranga National Park and Pakke and Nameri Tiger Reserves further enhances its importance for maintaining contiguity over a larger landscape so essential for longterm wildlife conservation. It has been an important corridor for regular wildlife movement, especially elephants," Ranjit Kakati, a research scholar (zoology) at Gauhati

Nature's Bonyapran, said. Behali RF which comprises subtropical semi-evergreen wet forests account for 308 native plant species – several of those endemic to Behali-besides 49 mammal species, over 280 bird species, 23 snakes, 12 turtles, 11 lizards, 12 amphibians and 275

butterfly species. Significantly, Behali accounts for a number of endemic species rarely associated with a single stretch of forest.

Even those unable to physically join the rally at Zokhawthar village expressed their solidarity, participating in Khawmawi in Myanmar's Chin state, across the border. Mizoram shares a 510-km-long border with Myanmar's Chin state and the Mizos share ethnic ties with people belonging to the Chin community.

Putin's visit to China, the second since last October, follows Xi's just concluded European Union tour to France, Serbia and Hungary where the Chinese leader came under pressure from EU leaders not to sell arms to Russia. The US too is mounting pressure on China not to sell arms

to Russia. While Xi, 70, regards his ties with Putin, 71, as counter to the US' increasing hostility towards China, which Beijing says is aimed at countering its rise, there is unease here over the Russian leader's continuation of the

Ukraine war. Though Beijing has not publically supported Russia's invasion of Ukraine, the "nolimits" China-Russia strategic partnership has come under intense scrutiny from the US and its allies, who have imposed sanctions on Moscow and repeatedly called Beijing to use its leverage to bring

Doctor suspended over sexual harassment of girl students

GUWAHATI, May 16: Dr Tirtha Dyuti Choudhury, Reader of SJN Homeopathic Medical College & Hospital, has been placed under suspension following an inquiry over an alleged case of sexual harassment of two of his girl students.

Stating that the preliminary inquiry established the commission of the alleged offence, an official release said that in response to the show-cause notice served to the offender, "the delinquent Reader of SJN-HMCH has not been able to put forward any cogent reason justifying his innocence".

'Therefore, in view of the aforementioned gross misconduct committed by Dr Tirtha Dyuti Choudhury, Reader, Department of Organon of Medicine, SJN Homeopathic Medical College & Hospital, is placed under suspension with immediate effect pending drawal of disciplinary proceedings.

"During the period of suspension, Dr Choudhury will be paid subsistence allowance as per rule, and he is barred from carrying out private practice or any other employment, business, profession or vocation as stipulated... until further orders," the official order said.

"During the period of suspension, the headquarters of Dr Firtha Dyuti Choudhury shall be Guwahati and he shall not leave his headquarters without obtaining the written permission of the Principal i/c, SJN Homeopathic Medical College & Hospital," it added.

Sikkim Statehood day celebrated at Rai Bhavan



Show cause notices to 2 AIUDF MLAs

He said that the AIUDF adheres to certain policies and principles and the decisions taken by the party are binding upon all its members.

"They violated the party's rules and tarnished the image of our party and our party president. That is why the party has been forced to take this decision. If we do not receive any satisfactory reply from them within the next five days, then the party will take appropriate action against them as per our party's constitution," Islam said.

Rabies cases on the rise in Guwahati

Dog population management with anti-rabies vaccination only solution: Dr SS Dutta

GUWAHATI, May 16: Is Guwahati staring at a potential public health crisis in the form of rabies?

Post-mortem examinations have revealed that more than 20 free roaming dogs in Guwahati have been diagnosed to be suspected cases of rabies in the last six months, which, according to experts, is an alarming figure, largely attributed to a surge in stray dog populations coupled with insufficient vaccination coverage.

The 'unprecedented' uptick in reported cases of rabies among stray dogs and instances of human exposure has now put almost every neighbourhood of Guwahati at risk!

The alarming revelation, according to experts, is just the tip of the iceberg since the discovery was made during routine examinations of the limited number of deceased stray dogs who were brought to the College of Veterinary Science, Khanapara.

Concerns have further been amplified by ever rising instances of dog bites not just in Guwahati but across the State.

More than 55,000 individuals fall victim to dog bites in Assam



every year, majority of them from stray dogs.

Information accessed by this correspondent revealed that rabies has reportedly claimed nearly 25 human deaths during the last five years, and doctors are of the opinion that the human deaths due to rabies are mostly underreported.

Efforts to access information from the ISDP cell of the National Health Mission related to human deaths due to rabies, have, however, turned futile.

In a series of alarming incidents reported over the past few weeks in Guwahati, rabid dogs have unleashed a reign of terror across various neighbourhoods, targeting unsuspecting pedestrians.

In one of the latest incidents, a deranged stray dog attacked and bit two unsuspecting individuals including a Judge in Guwahati's Lamb Road area and the animal was later found to be rabid.

vas later found to be rabid. "Getting chased by a pack of dogs has become a common occurrence for me while coming back from office at night. This is posing a serious risk to residents' safety. Alarming sightings of aggressive canines have created an atmosphere of concern and fear," said Dheeraj Goswami, a resident of Christianbasti

Dr Sashanka Sekhar Dutta, the managing trustee and founder of JBF, contends that dog population management with anti-rabies vaccination is the only solution to this havoc. There are clear guidelines and Supreme Court orders for the ABC (Animal Birth Control) and ARV (Anti-Rabies Vaccination) programme, but unfortunately, this concern remains neglected in the State.

Dr Dutta has requested the Government machinery to take appropriate steps to implement this programme.

"With incidents of dog bites cases continuing to be on the rise in Guwahati and elsewhere, the looming threat of rabid dogs in our neighbourhood has left the community, especially the kids, vulnerable," a Guwahati-based veterinarian said requesting anonymity.

Even as the concerns mount, the magnitude and gravity of the problem apparently continues to be undermined by the authorities concerned, with the citizens alleging lack of urgency.

Unfortunately, although the menace of dog bites continues to torment Guwahatians with their population increasing manifold, no census of the animal has been done till date.

In fact, Guwahati does not even have a dog squad or a shelter home which speaks volumes of the indifferent attitude of the Guwahati Municipal Corporation.
Dr Kailash Chamua of the Guwahati Municipal Corporation said that since 2014, as many as 22,197 stray dogs have been sterilized and administered anti-rabies vaccination.

However, there is no data available about the exact number of free roaming dogs that have been given anti-rabies vaccine till date.

Similarly, Dr Sankar Lahkar of the Directorate of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary informed that in the year 2022-23, around 38,500 doses of vaccine were administered on pet dogs across 25 districts, except the Sixth Schedule districts. The number in the year 2023-24 stands at 31,300.

"There has always been a constant rise in the number of rabies cases, but, of late, there seems to be an unprecedented spike, especially in Guwahati. We have to escalate the level of awareness about rabies, which remains a problem which was never given due attention despite its severity. The looming spectre of a rabies outbreak underscores the need for a coordinated drive by both government and non-government agencies," a source in the Health department said.

Opportune timing

he Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), 2019, which aims to fast-track Indian citizenship for refugees of all religions from Afghanistan, Pakistan and Bangladesh, apart from Muslims, was enacted four years back, but the framing of the rules for its implementation was completed only in March this year. Apparently, the BJP has decided that now, the middle of the unusually lengthy Lok Sabha election, is an opportune moment to take the process to its intended conclusion by having the Union Home Secretary publicly hand over the certificates of citizenship to 14 individuals at a ceremony in Delhi, after their applications were processed online through a designated portal, in the full glare of the media. Reportedly, around 300 more applicants were sent their certificates through emails. Certain aspects of the timing are significant. It may be recalled that when the CAA was first mooted, it had been Assam in particular, and the North-East in general, which had strongly protested against the Act, and initiated an anti-CAA movement that had strengthened into a crescendo of all-India proportions. The fear here is that CAA will initiate further demographic emasculation of the indigenous Assamese people in future through enabling citizenship for illegal Hindu migrants from Bangladesh detected in the NRC, while facilitating future migration of the same. Unfortunately, the twoyear long Covid-19 pandemic, when all public gatherings were banned, intruded and saw the petering away of the protests.

No doubt, the fact that the Lok Sabha election in Assam, where the distribution of certificates would have made an impact on the election, has concluded, might have had a role to play in the timing. It may also be noted that the next phase on May 20 in West Bengal will see key seats, where the Matua community that originally came from Bangladesh, holds sway. That the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) will try to extract electoral mileage from the certificate distribution is testified to by the comment of Union Home Minister Amit Shah, who held it up as an example of the actual realization of a 'Modi ki guarantee' and fulfilment of a campaign promise. The move has been made by the Union Home Ministry despite the fact that a clutch of petitions challenging the CAA and pleading for the North-East to be kept out of its purview are still pending before the Supreme Court of India. In fact, the Centre has asserted that CAA is not open to judicial review since matters of citizenship and foreign policy are prerogatives of the Parliament. Some observers of the ongoing Lok Sabha elections scenario have commented that the publicized distribution of certificates is aimed at firing up the BJP's base because doubts have started to crop up that the party might not win the landslide it had sought and, on the contrary, the Opposition INDIA bloc might even end up winning!

Successful raids

T n a major crackdown, the Assam Police busted a big network of cyber criminals, arresting 14 persons across several locations in the State. The coordinated operation spanned the areas of Lahorighat, Bhuragaon, Moirabari and Guwahati, where 16 special police teams conducted simultaneous raids and seized a large number of incriminating documents, including 396 SIM cards, 25 ATM cards, 14 chequebooks, three laptops, 34 mobile phones, 11 fake PAN cards and two printer machines. These materials are expected to serve as critical evidence in dismantling the networks of cybercriminals operating in the areas. The arrests – over 200 since 2023 - also go to highlight the growing magnitude of cybercrimes in the State in recent times. Morigaon, in particular, has emerged as a hub of cybercrime activities and one expects that the police will follow up on the arrests with appropriate interventions for checking the menace. With cybercrime assuming serious propositions in the State as also elsewhere, the police needs to equip itself in a matching manner to take on the gangs of cyber criminals who operate with a lot of dexterity. The common people, too, need to be on the guard against such scammers and abide by some basic guidelines that can go a long way in checking such crimes. The spurt in cybercrimes, especially online frauds, has resulted in loss of hard-earned money for the gullible victims.

The gravity of the situation warrants the common man to be cyber-educated to the desired extent. This is because almost everyone today has to engage oneself in some online activity/transaction or the other. Indeed, a majority of such cases of fraud can be averted by exercising some precaution and applying common sense. In many cases, the victims act in an irresponsible manner by sharing personal details like ATM pin and OTP with the fraudsters or downloading some harmful app at their instance. This is particularly surprising given that online fraud has registered an all-time high across the country and there have also been sustained awareness campaigns by banks in recent times on the do's and don'ts concerning cyber fraud. The anonymity of the Internet user and the absence of geographical boundaries in the cyber world have made e-crimes a rather complex affair, especially in investigating cases and bringing the culprits to book. Police officials being the first respondents to crimes, it is all the more imperative that their capacity building is enhanced for handling offences having a digital perspective. There is also an urgent need to adopt a pragmatic policy that accords due thrust on the varied aspects of the crimes including prevention and follow-up. Among other things, a convergence of investigating agencies, academicians and industry is a must to devise the right kind of response mechanism. This calls for enhanced interface among these three so that preventing and probing cybercrimes becomes easier. Also imperative is to keep updating the skills of the cybercrime investigators through periodical advanced training regimes.

India's cybersecurity fears

yberspace refers to a digitally interconnected environment that serves as a dynamic virtual realm linking diverse computer systems. There is ongoing discourse among scholars and political theorists on whether cyberspace should be classified as a global common or global public good. Given its universal accessibility, cyberspace is highly vulnerable to cyber threats, making its protection crucial for national security and integrity. Cyberattacks are particularly insidious, as they are capable of originating from anywhere in the world, targeting multiple victims simultaneously, and they are difficult to trace due to internet anonymity. Cyberattacks can severely impact critical digital infrastructure, leading to financial losses, compromised sensitive data, or disruptions in essential services. With internet governance assuming greater significance and cybersecurity becoming pivotal for national prosperity, cyber diplomacy has emerged as a focal point in foreign policy worldwide, including in India. Since the inception of the 'Digital India' programme in 2015, India has transitioned toward a digitally empowered society and economy, significantly expanding its utilization of cyberspace and the internet. Like other nations, India heavily relies on digital platforms for diplomacy, commerce and strategic communication, underscoring the imperative of safeguarding cyberspace to protect national interests.

India consistently contends with threats to its cyberspace. Cybersecurity risks in India encompass various forms such as financial fraud, identity theft, phishing, and ransomware assaults. The nation frequently finds itself targeted by state-sponsored cyber assaults, notably from neighbouring countries. These attacks are orchestrated to pilfer sensitive data, disrupt critical digital infrastruc-

ture, or engage in espionage endeavours, all in pursuit of strategic objectives. Malevolent actors, including 'hacktivists,' continue to pose threats to India's cyber landscape, often driven by political or social motives.

Tensions along the border and in strategic relations with neighbouring countries spill over into the digital arena, rendering India susceptible to cyber attacks. China, as a formidable neighbour, presents an ongoing threat to India's cyberspace. Backed by state-sponsored cyber units and a robust cyber infrastructure, China poses a considerable risk to India's cybersecurity. Numerous cyber espionage operations have been linked to China, targeting Indian government entities, critical infrastructure, and private sectors. These intrusions seek to extract sensitive information, secure strategic advantages, and compromise India's national security. Several notable cyber incidents attributed to China's activities targeting India encompass cyber espionage, critical infrastructure attacks, economic espionage, influence operations, and cyber warfare. Chinese state-sponsored hacking groups have targeted Indian government agencies, military institutions, and defence contractors to illicitly obtain sensitive information. Allegedly, China has conducted cyber assaults aimed at India's critical infrastructure, encompassing power grids, telecommunications networks, and financial systems. Such attacks pose a significant threat to India's national security and economic stability, as they can disrupt essential services and erode public confidence. In April 2022, Recorded Future disclosed that Chinese statesponsored hackers had targeted India's power grids in Ladakh, with the possible objective of gathering information on India's critical infrastructure or preparing for future sabotage. Chinese cyber actors have directed their efforts towards Indian companies and research institutions, aiming to pilfer intellectual property, trade secrets, and proprietary information. This form of economic espionage undermines India's competitiveness, innovation and economic growth by compromising valuable assets and undermining market integrity. A Chinese state-linked hacker group boasted of targeting key offices of the Indian government, including the PMO and businesses like Reliance Industries Limited and Air India. China has leveraged cyber means to shape narratives, manipulate public opinion, and influence political discourse within India. Through coordinated disinformation campaigns, dissemination of fake news, and manipulation of social media, Chinese actors seek to advance their strategic interests, sow discord, and undermine the foundations of India's democratic institutions.

The escalating tensions between India and China have heightened concerns over the potential for cyber warfare. While no overt instances of cyber warfare have been reported, both have demonstrated capabilities and intent to engage in offensive cyber operations, raising the spectre of cyber escalation in future conflicts. The most recent escalation between the two nations occurred following the Galwan Valley conflict. After this altercation, concerns arose regarding heightened cyber espionage efforts by both countries and potential increases in surveillance activities aimed at monitoring each other's military movements and strategic intentions.

There are several instances of China targeting India's cyberspace. In October 2020, significant parts of Mumbai experienced a widespread blackout impacting suburban railways and hospitals. Months later, Recorded Future reported that a China-affiliated hacker group known as 'RedEcho' breached the Indian power sector, potentially contributing to Mumbai's power outage. Additionally, Re-

corded Future indicated that aside from the power sector, Chinese hackers also targeted two Indian ports and various segments of the railway infrastructure. The Chinese commitment to targeting India is exemplified by the Advanced Persistent Threat 30 (APT30) vector. This espionage operation persisted for a decade before being uncovered in 2015. It systematically collected information from Indian computer networks concerning geopolitical matters pertinent to the Chinese Communist Party. These included the India-China border dispute, Indian naval activities in the South China Sea, and India's relationships with neighbouring South Asian nations. In 2020, the decision to ban Chinese-linked applications was taken after the confirmation that these applications contain material prejudicial to the sovereignty and integrity of India. This action by the Indian government was based on several complaints of extortion and harassment of common people.

India is bolstering its cyber defences and engaging in offensive cyber actions in response to escalating Chinese cyber espionage efforts. However, more proactive measures are needed. First, India should provide technical evidence to attribute these attacks to Chinese state-sponsored hackers, a step that the national security establishment has been hesitant about despite ample evidence presented by the technical community. Additionally, New Delhi requires a dedicated mechanism to monitor these offensive operations. While intelligence and security agencies monitor foreign spying campaigns, cyber activity is often treated as isolated incidents without linking them to the broader Chinese cyber espionage campaign and state-sponsored hacking groups. India ought to prioritize the development of indigenous cybersecurity solutions, technologies and expertise to reduce dependence on Chinese imports.

Ethics in AI-based learning

Policymakers must develop clear guidelines for the use of artificial intelligence in educational settings.

oday, no one can ignore the role of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in our daily lives. AI can bring benefits to our lives by improving human comfort, health, safety and productivity. Knowingly or unknowingly, we have been availing AI-based services almost every day in the form of searching documents using Google, using GPS to find the shortest path to a destination, reading or writing emails or messages, or fetching appropriate movies. In each of these applications, AI and machine learning have been applied to a significant extent. In addition to these numerous applications, AI has also been massively applied in education. Both AI and education are evolving rapidly, and their unification generates significant discourse about ethical considerations. With increasing applications of AI in education, the ethical implications of its usage become more prominent. Therefore, it is essential to identify the ethical challenges raised due to such growing application of AI in education, and the learners must be informed on how to address them. The academicians, administrators and policymakers need to navigate the complex application landscape to ensure that AI solutions are used in education both ethically and responsibly.

One major ethical challenge of AI-based learning is to ensure the privacy and security of student data. To implement AI-based educational technologies, the administrators collect voluminous data from each student. It is the primary ingredient for any AI model. Such data may range from personal to extracurricular to academic performances. The use of such voluminous data for training AI models raises questions

about its ownership and privacy protection. My personal experiences while addressing students inside the country as well as abroad also reveal that today's students are very much concerned about the privacy of their personal data. The repeated occurrences of incidents related to data scandals and security breaches may have compelled them to become more protective of their data. So, AI-based educational technologists must have to ensure that data are gathered and used following certain clear and transparent guidelines accepted mutually by both the parties, i.e., students or their guardians and the institution.

Another major ethical concern is raised due to biases in AI models. AI bias refers to non-conformity or anomaly in the predictions or decision-making due to some prejudiced assumption(s). The excessive dependence on biased AI-based models often leads to human biases. AI models mostly suffer from two biases. First, cognitive biases cause unconscious errors that mislead human judgements and decisions. This type of bias mostly occurs due to human attempts to simplify the information describing the real world used for analysis. Such cognitive biases are usually soaked by AI-based methods unknowingly while developing the prediction model or during training the model. Second, a lack of completeness in training data also causes AI bias. Incomplete or partial data cannot represent the student population fairly. For example, considering only UG student data cannot provide a proper representation of the whole population in an HEI. So, AI technologists must be careful to make their models free from these biases.

The influence of AI in human decision-

making is another major concern. AI methods have been used to make predictions about students' future performances or to generate recommendations about personalized learning paths. Although such predictions are helpful in the performance evaluation of the learners, they can also be selffulfilling prophecies, attempting to shape students' opportunities based on their predicted outcomes. So, provided with predictions given by AI models, an academician or an administrator should not straightway accept or reject them without applying their own intelligence. An appropriate reliance in decision-making occurs when the human accepts a correct AI prediction or corrects an incorrect AI prediction. An underreliance is a situation which occurs when the human fails to accept a correct AI prediction, whereas overreliance occurs when the human fails to correct an incorrect AI prediction.

Educational administrators are to be adequately trained to act with appropriate reliance on AI models. Further, there is always a risk that students could become overly reliant on AI-based systems, potentially undermining their critical thinking and problem-solving skills.

Inadequate or non-optimal learning of AI models is another major ethical issue that leads to inaccurate decision-making. AI models are software programmes that are written based on machine-learning algorithms. Such programmes are trained using task-specific data (or, examples or references) to generate appropriate predictions to satisfy the intended goals. For accurate decision-making, such programmes need to be trained using several sets of learning data so that they can identify the

desired patterns in them and use the learnings to generate a fair and unbiased decision for the given task at hand. When modelling students' learning performances with partial or inadequate training data, and identifying at-risk students, AI methods may provide more accurate predictions for a group of students than the others simply based on the different demographic tributes of the students (e.g., female vs male). So, learning highly influences the performances of such AI models. The use of learning data with any form of deficiencies such as incompleteness, irrelevance, non-recency, or a lack of reliability causes biased or inaccurate decision-making by the AI models. Further, the rate at which the AI models are trained is controlled by a set of parameters. For the best possible learning rate, these parameters are to be welltuned by a trial-and-error method. The inappropriate setting of these parameters will lead to an inappropriate learning rate and hence will cause biased or inappropriate decision-making.

Lack of transparency and explainability is another major ethical issue. Transparency in AI refers to an adequate understanding of the actions of the AI system in real time for better awareness of the situation. On the other hand, explainability deals with providing information on the logic and reasoning used in the decision-making process, and how the system actions are decided. It refers to the ability of the human being to understand and evaluate the predictions made by the AI models based on the underlying reasoning. So, a lack of adequate transparency and explainability will lower the acceptability of AI-based systems and will lead to a state of underreliance.

A total of 110 State-run schools were rechristened as Vidyajvoti schools in 2019, and the CBSE curriculum was introduced in them. While 61 per cent of students cleared the CBSE Class X examinations, 59 per cent were successful in the Class XII examinations.

"Today, we came here to meet Director of Secondary Education NC Sharma and tell him about the anger among students and parents after the disastrous results. The BJP Government introduced the CBSE curriculum without creating proper infrastructure, mainly trained teachers. This has pushed thousands of students to a bleak future," SFI's State secretary Sandipan Deb said. - PTI

Stink bug outbreak sparks concern 1 held in illegal appointments in Mamit town of Mizoram

AIZAWL, May 16: Reports coming in from Mamit town and its surrounding villages along the border with Tripura and Bangladesh, have raised alarm over the outbreak of Udonga montana, a stinky species of Pentatomid bug, locally known as thangnang. Swarms of these bugs have been spotted on tree branches, though no damage has been caused by them so far.

According to local sources, villagers collect these bugs and extract a pungent oil from them, which is sold at Rs 50 per cup. This has traditionally served as edible oil for the tribal population, although its

quent devastation caused by rodents in agricultural areas.

Local scientists have predicted recurrence of such famine-like conditions in 2025, coinciding with the next anticipated cycle of Thing tam. The looming threat underscores the importance of vigilance and proactive measures to mitigate potential agricultural losses and ensure food security in the region.

The teachers said that they had to spend a considerable amount of time recording their daily attendance in the app, which subsequently affects their teaching.

In the last three days the authorities concerned have not informed the teachers about the snag in the app due to which they wasted their time trying to capture their attendance online. They called upon the authorities to inform the schools immediately if any such situation arises in the future.

It may be mentioned that the online attendance in Siksha Setu app will be linked to payment of monthly salaries to teachers soon. If the Shiksha Setu app continues to malfunction, the teachers may have to face unnecessary harassment in the future.

GUWAHATI, May 16: The Maligaon-headquartered Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) has surpassed its annual target for track renewal works in the 2023-24 financial year.

The track renewal works were undertaken as part of the Indian Railways' safety action plan.

"Several track renewal works were undertaken by the NFR zone during the 2023-24 fiscal. The main aim of the works was to maintain the railway tracks in proper condition and to provide safe transportation and comfortable journey to the commuters. These track renewal works surpassed the annual targets set by the zone during the last fiscal year," an official said.

As a part of the safety action plan, nearly 258 track kilometres (TKM) of 'Through Rail Renewal', over 210 TKM of 'Through Sleeper Renewal', and more than 264 units of Complete Track Renewal works were completed in 2023-24.

In addition, NFR also achieved 7.27 lakh cubic metre of progress in ballasting works as against a target of 5 lakh cubic metre.

"This is the highest ever progress in the zone surpassing the previous year's headway of 6.34 lakh cubic metre. In addition, 134 Thick Web Switches were installed last fiscal, up from 35 during 2022-23. As a part of the road safety works and for ease of movement of both the road and rail users, 19 manned level crossings were eliminated. Besides, 20 road over bridges (ROBs) and 48 road under bridges (RUBs) were commissioned across the zone during 2023-24,' the official said.

The maximum speed limit on 118.20 km length of loop lines was raised to 30 km per hour, and the sectional speed on 803.5 km of stretch was raised to 110 km per hour, marking a progress of 42 per cent.

"Latest surveillance techniques like structural health monitoring, 3D scanning of river beds, underwater inspection by Remote Operated Robotic Vehicle (RORV), scour monitoring, and water level monitoring were also undertaken for keeping a watch on railway bridges. Besides, nine additional waterways were constructed to mitigate the problem of flooding during the monsoon season," the official said.

He said that the maintenance of tracks at regular intervals resulted in smooth operations of trains and also provided a better riding experience for passengers.

Drought-like situation in West Karbi Anglong

DIPHU, May 16: The West Karbi Anglong district is currently experiencing a severe drought-like situation, particularly in the agricultural lands within the Hawaipur and West Rongkhang revenue areas.

This situation poses a significant threat to the livelihoods of approximately 90% of the population who rely heavily on agricultural activities such as sugarcane, vegetables, paddy, wheat, and several horticultural items.

The lack of adequate water for the crops to mature and thrive is a major concern, as the fields typically require water for at least 40 days to two months after cultivation. Furthermore, the absence of functional irrigation schemes in the area has exacerbated the issue, leaving the farmers without crucial crop support.

KAZIRANGA, May 16: The second meeting of the Anti-Rhino Poaching Task Force was held at Kaziranga on Thursday with an objective to strengthen the strategies and adopt measures to check poaching activities at all rhino-bearing protected forests in the State.

The meeting was chaired by Special Director General of Police Harmeet Singh and attended by senior police officials, including IGP of STF and CR, and superintendents of police of Golaghat, Nagaon, Sonitpur, Darrang, Biswanath and Karbi Anglong districts. Senior forest officials, including Director of Kaziranga National Park and Tiger Reserve Dr Sonali Ghosh and DFOs, attended

government agencies. While presentation was made by the forest and police officials from four rhino-bearing protected areas, a few recommendations had been made by the committee.

It is worth mentioning that due to concerted efforts of the State government, the population of rhino has increased, indicating a positive sign. However, with the increase in the population, some rhinos have even ventured into newer areas such as Majuli and Bura Chapori in the last two years.

This was a matter of concern for which the review meeting recommended that these new areas would be mapped and measures identified, including setting up of new forest camps and regular patrolling routes.

The meeting also recommended addition of new members in the committee, including IGPs of NR and ER and DFOs of Nagoan, Golaghat and Jorhat territorial divisions and commandants of the Assam Forest Protection Force for greater coordination and surveillance.

A regular coordination meeting in all rhino-bearing areas at district level has also been recommended to increase operational capabilities.

NEW DELHI, May 16: AAP Rajya Sabha member Swati Maliwal today broke her silence over the alleged assault on her, saying she has recorded her statement with the Delhi Police and the BJP should not indulge in politics over the incident.

Cong's Ragini Nayak on Maliwal incident: Congress spokesperson Ragini Nayak today said strict action should be taken against the person who was involved in the alleged assault on AAP Rajya Sabha MP Swati Maliwal.

The Congress and the Aam Aadmi Party are fighting elections under the banner of INDIA bloc in the national capital.

Navak said the Congress party's stand in the matter has been absolutely clear.

"If any crime takes place against a woman, whoever is involved in the crime, whether he belongs to any political party or not, strictest action should be taken against him. (AAP MP) Sanjay Singh also said the same thing and the Congress party also said the same," Nayak said.

She further stated that Maliwal herself understands her legal rights since she was the Chairperson of DCW. It was probably she who called the police and informed them about the incident, she said. "The legal process will take it own course," she added. - PTI

AZAMGARH/BHADOHI (UP), May 16: Prime Minister Narendra Modi today accused the Opposition of spreading lies and inciting violence over the Citizenship (Amendment) Act, and said that the law is here to stay.

Addressing an election rally in Azamgarh a day after the first set of citizenship certificates under the new law were issued, he dared the Opposition parties to muster whatever forces they could against the CAA.

They will never be able to scrap the law, he asserted, saying in Hindi, "Kya iss desh me ab tak koi mai ka lal paida hua hai jo CAA ko khatam kar sake?

"These people are Hindus, Sikhs, Jains and Buddhists. They have been living in the country for a long time as refugees and were victims of the partition of the country done on the basis of religion," he said.

Modi addressed three more back-to-back election rallies in quick succession in Bhadohi, Jaunpur and Pratapgarh in Uttar Pradesh, targeting the Congress and the Samajwadi Partv.

In Bhadohi, where the two parties are backing a Trinamool Congress candidate as INDIA bloc partners, the Prime Minister accused them to trying out West Bengal's "TMC politics" in Uttar Pradesh. The brand, he claimed, represented politics of appeasement and harassment of Dalits and women.

In Pratapgarh, he said the Opposition INDIA bloc wants to appoint five Prime Ministers in five years and predicted that the alliance will disintegrate after June 4, when the Lok Sabha election results are out.

"Khata khat, khata khat,"

he said in Hindi, suggesting that it will happen rapidly and also mocking Congress leader Rahul Gandhi for using the phrase to claim that a fixed stipend would flow into the accounts of poor women if his party comes to power.

Modi accused the Congress and its allies of neglecting the refugees over the years because they were not part of their own "vote bank".

"The Congress and the SP tried to spread lies in the name of CAA. They tried to push Uttar Pradesh and the entire country towards riots," he claimed.

"You are frauds... You forced the country to burn in the fire of communalism," he said, claiming he had "exposed" the Opposition.

He said voters in Kashmir felt proud to participate in the festival of democracy. "The excitement shown by people of Srinagar in polls is proof that no one can bring back Article 370 and do vote-bank politics."

"Earlier during polls in Kashmir, there used to be protests, people used to fear for their lives and get threats from terrorists. But this time previous polling records were broken in Srinagar," the PM said.

At the rallies, he listed development projects undertaken in the State and praised Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's handling of law and order.

"Terrorists accused of explosions were pardoned. Sleeper cells were given the cover of politics. Due to this attitude, terrorism rose across the country," Modi said, attacking former CM Akhilesh Yadav whom he called SP's "shehzade", or prince.

The SP and Congress are two parties but have one "shop" where they sell appeasement, lies, dynastic politics and corruption, he charged. - PTI

Z-plus security for former NIA DG Dinkar Gupta

NEW DELHI, May 16: Former NIA Director General Dinkar Gupta was recently provided the top Z-plus category VIP security cover by the Union government in view of potential threats to him from pro-Khalistan elements, official sources said today.

Gupta, a former Punjab Police DGP, retired from service in April.

A Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) VIP security wing has been entrusted with the task to secure the 1987batch Indian Police Service

A contingent of about 40 CRPF personnel will now be deployed in shifts to secure Gupta during his presence in Punjab and Delhi, the sources said.

A threat perception report prepared by the Central intelligence and security agencies necessitated the top category cover for Gupta due to his work in the NIA and in the Punjab Police against pro-Khalistan elements, they said. - PTI

Will soon file prosecution complaint against Kejriwal, AAP: ED to SC

potential trouble for Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, the Enforcement Directorate today told the Supreme Court it will soon file a prosecution complaint against him and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) in a money laundering case related to the alleged excise policy scam.

Additional Solicitor General SV Raju, appearing for the ED, told a bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta that the agency pro to file a prosecution complaint (chargesheet) against Kejriwal and the AAP. "We will do it shortly. It is in the pipeline," he told the court.

The ED made the statement when the court was hearing Kejriwal's challenge to his arrest in the money laundering case arising from the alleged Delhi excise scam.

Raju claimed the probe agency has enough evidence to show that Kejriwal de-

"We have direct evidence that Kejriwal stayed in a seven-star hotel, whose bills were partly paid by an accused in the case," Raju submitted, adding Kejriwal played a key role in the for-

mulation of the now scrapped Delhi excise policy. He alleged that Kejriwal, as the National Convener of the AAP, was vicariously responsible for the alleged scam. Kejriwal, despite being the Chief Minister, does not hold any departmental portfolio.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, who also appeared for the ED, questioned the maintainability of the petition, saying that barring the first two occasions when Kejriwal opposed the remand orders, he virtually "consented" to judicial custody.


He submitted the court cannot hold a mini-trial at the remand stage and examine material and other evidence available with the investigating officer.

"The court can only see whether there is any material for arrest and not what material is there. In this case, the materials were seen by the trial court and the High Court. The High Court had summoned the case files and perused the material, Minitrial, which this court is called upon to do, is what we are opposing," he submitted.

Mehta said that if this court starts interfering at the remand stage, it will open the doors for powerful people to approach the apex court directly, without following the procedure prescribed under the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC). "There are certain in-built safeguards provided under Section 19 of PMLA, which deals with powers of arrest of ED officer. More rigorous the provision of arrest, the less scrutiny by courts," he said.

The bench, however, did not agree with the submission of Mehta and said that if there is a violation of Section 19 conditions, the courts can interfere.

"There are several petitions led directly in the Si Court under Article 32 and this court has nullified arrests or granted bail. Yes, the remedy cannot be excluded and remand court or the High Court usually look into these aspects. It is not that we don't have jurisdiction but normally we observe judicial restraint, because there are alternate remedies available. However, we cannot overlook when there is a grave case," the bench told Mehta. - PTI

39% candidates in 6th phase of LS polls are crorepatis: ADR

NEW DELHI, May 16: About 39 per cent of candidates contesting in the sixth phase of the Lok Sabha polls are crorepatis with average assets of Rs 6.21 crore, according to poll rights body ADR. Among the candidates

contesting in the sixth phase on May 25, the highest assets have been declared by BJP candidates from Kurukshetra Naveen Jindal at Rs 1,241 crore followed by Santrupt Misra at Rs 482 crore and Sushil Gupta at Rs 169 crore, the analysis by Association of Democratic Reforms said.

Out of the 866 candidates contesting the Lok Sabha polls, 338 (39 per cent) are crorepatis and the average assets per candidate contesting in the Lok Sabha phase VI election is Rs 6.21 crore.

Among the major parties, all six candidates from BJD, four out of four candidates each from RJD and JD(U),

48 (94 per cent) out of 51 candidates from BJP, 11 (92 per cent) out of 12 candidates from SP, 20 (80 per cent) out of 25 candidates from Congress, 4 (80 per cent) out of 5 candidates from AAP and 7 (78 per cent) candidates out of 9 candidates from AITC have declared assets worth more than Rs 1 crore.

Among the lowest asset declaration is Master Randhir Singh, an Independent candidate from Rohtak, who declared Rs 2 worth of assets followed by Ram Kumar Yadav, a candidate from SUCI(C) in Pratapgarh, who declared assets worth Rs 1,686.

About 411 (47 per cent) candidates have declared liabilities in their affidavits. About 180 (21 per cent)

out of 866 candidates have declared criminal cases against them and 141 (16 per cent) out of 866 have declared serious criminal cases against themselves.

As many as 12 candidates have declared cases where they have been convicted and six candidates have declared cases related to murder (IPC Section 302) against themselves.

The ADR said 21 candidates have declared cases related to attempt to murder (IPC Section 307) against themselves and 24 candidates have declared cases related to crime against women. Out of 24 candidates, 3

candidates have declared charges related to rape (IPC Section 376) and whoever commits rape repeatedly on the same woman, shall be punished with rigorous imprisonment for a term which shall not be less than ten years, but may extend to imprisonment (IPC Section

376(2)(n). The report said 16 candidates have declared cases related to hate speech against themselves. - PTI

HD Revanna gets interim bail in sexual harassment case

BENGALURU, May 16: A court here today granted interim bail to JD(S) MLA and former Karnataka minister HD Revanna in a sexual harassment case.

The case of sexual harassment of a 47-year-old house help was registered against Revanna and his son and MP Prajwal Revanna at the Holenarsipur town police station in Hassan district on April 28.

Prajwal reportedly left for Germany on April 27 and is still at large. The complainant had claimed that the father-son duo had sexually abused her at the 66-year-old MLA's house. The Special Investigation Team (SIT) which is probing the alleged sexual abuse charges against Prajwal and related cases, had sought custody of the former minister.

Revanna's advocates sought anticipatory bail in the case. However, the 42nd Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Court (ACMM) heard the matter and gave interim relief to Revanna till Friday.

The SIT had sent two notices to Revanna, son of JD(S) patriarch and former PM HD Deve Gowda, and Prajwal to join the investigation, but both of them skipped it.

Today Revanna applied for anticipatory bail and the SIT objected to this and sought his custody or that he be remanded in judicial custody. The court however decided to hear the matter again on Friday. - PTI

Nearly 67% voter turnout in first 4 phases of LS polls: EC NEW DELHI, May 16:

The cumulative turnout in the first four phases of the Lok Sabha elections has been recorded at 66.95 per cent, the Election Commission said today, adding, 45.10 crore of the nearly 97 crore electors have voted so far in the ongoing electoral exercise.

In a statement, the poll panel urged electorate to come out and vote in large num-

bers in the coming phases. According to the poll authority, the updated voter turnout in the fourth phase of polling held on May 13 was 69.16 per cent, 3.65 percentage points higher than the corresponding phase in the 2019 parliamentary polls.

The updated voter turnout figures for the third phase of polling in the Lok Sabha election stood at 65.68 per cent. In the third phase of the 2019 general election, the turnout was 68.4 per cent.

In the second phase of the election held on April 26, the turnout was recorded at 66.71 per cent as against the 69.64 per cent in the second phase of the 2019 polls.

In the first phase of the ongoing general elections, a 66.14 per cent turnout was recorded. In the 2019 polls, the turnout in the first phase was 69.43 per cent.

The EC said there is enhanced focus on to inform, motivate and facilitate voters

in the remaining three phases of the parliamentary polls and State Chief Electoral Officers have been asked to step up measures.

"The commission strongly believes that partnership and collaboration are essential pillars of voter awareness programme. It's really heartening to see that on commission's request, different institutions, influencers and celebrities having significant reach are working enthusiastically on pro bono basis,' Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar said.

A total of 379 seats across 23 States and Union Territories have voted in the first four phases of elections.

A high voter turnout, Kumar felt, would be a message from Indian voters to the world about the strength of Indian democracy. He urged voters to cast their ballot in huge numbers, as voting day is not a holiday but a day of pride to participate in the festival of democracy.

The poll panel also listed out outreach efforts undertaken by various private and public bodies to enhance voter participation in the elections. Banks, post offices, private entities and telecom platforms are using their public interface to encourage registered voters to turn up at the polling stations on various voting days. - PTI

Bought leaf tea factories to shut operations from June 1

Decision adopted collectively to uphold reputation of Assam tea

DIBRUGARH, May 16: Following non-redressal of grievances by the State government, Tea Board and the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI), the Assam Bought Leaf Tea Manufacturers' Association (ABLTMA) has yet again announced its decision to shut down its factories from June

ABLTMA president Chand Kumar Gohain has said that FSSAI-compliant tea cannot

STAFF CORRESPONDENT be manufactured from noncompliant green tea leaves. According to the tea manufacturers, the small tea growers must supply FSSAI-compliant green tea leaves to the factories, a step which is nearly impossible for the small scale farmers as there are no laboratories in the State to test green tea leaves.

> Addressing newsmen here on Wednesday evening, Gohain said that ABLTMA member factories will not operate until and unless compliant green tea leaves are

supplied to them.

The association urged the small tea growers to take appropriate steps to ensure their produce is certified as compliant before taking them to the factories. The decision has been collectively adopted by the manufacturers' body to uphold the reputation of Assam tea, stated Gohain.

The ABLTMA president added that if member tea factories are required to take the non-compliant green tea leaves, a standard operating procedure (SOP) must be worked out so that no stakeholder remains aggrieved.

The ABLTMA has also

urged the Tea Board and the Ministry of Commerce and Industry to withdraw the notification through which it mandated 100% of dust grades tea to be sold through public tea auctions, asserting that 56% of dust tea of the bought leaf tea factories have remained unsold in the auctions. The association also demanded that until an adequate number of laboratories are established in the State for testing green tea leaves, the regulatory sample collections must be stopped. Deven Singh, advisor to ABLTMA, who also ad-

leaves are non-compliant. "However, major tea companies are making orthodox tea out of these non-compliant green tea leaves to bring bad name to Assam tea as no step has been taken to test these orthodox grades. Over and above, the orthodox grade of tea is largely exported. If it fails the test in the international market, it will unquestionably bring bad name to Assam tea. Therefore, strict measures must be introduced to ensure that non-compliant green tea leaves from Assam are not used to make orthodox tea so as to protect the reputation of Assam tea," Singh said.

Exports may rise 12-15 pc to cross \$500 bn this fiscal: FIEO

Govt should address issues like credit flow, interest subsidy and set up e-commerce hubs

NEW DELHI, May 16: The country's merchandise exports are expected to increase about USD 60-70 billion to USD 500 billion by the end of FY25 on account of gradual improvement in global demand, apex exporters' body FIEO said on Thursday.

In 2023-24, exports dipped over 3 per cent to USD 437.1 billion.

Federation of Indian Export Organisations (FIEO) President Ashwini Kumar also said the country's services exports are also likely to reach USD 390-400 billion this fiscal.

"We are looking for merchandise exports between USD 500-510 billion in 2024-25. In the services, we expect exports to be around USD 390-400 billion for the current fiscal," Kumar told reporters here.

He said traditional markets like the US and Europe will help boost India's exports.

Sectors such as electronics, electricals, engineering, and pharma will play a key role in boosting shipments. However, the new President said they are concerned as labour-intensive sectors like knitted and woven garments, footwear, gem and iewellery are doing good.

In the footwear sector, while global imports grew at a CAGR of 5 per cent, India's exports contracted.

"The focus on skilling is still lacking as per piece production in many segments is much less as compared to Vietnam, Indonesia, Bangladesh, Cambodia," he said.

He suggested that the government address certain issues such as credit flow, interest subsidy and set up ecommerce hubs in the country to provide a cushion to the exporting community.

The share of export credit in the net bank credit is extremely low and not commensurate with the share of India's exports in the GDP, which is over 20 per cent, he said. "The demand for the credit has gone up with rising inflation, high commodity prices and abnormal increase in sea as well as air freight," he added.

With the longer voyage time, on account of diversion of cargo through the Cape of Good Hope, coupled with slow offtake from the shelves. the buyers are also taking longer time to remit export proceeds necessitating higher credit for a longer period.

"This requires additional flow at most competitive rates," he said, adding, "We are proposing to create an Export Development Fund to assist exporters, in undertaking export promotional activities".

For this, a budgetary support equivalent to 1 per cent of preceding year's export in Indian rupee can be made available every year through the budget grant to the department of commerce.

He also said that huge potential is there to boost exports by about USD 250-300 billion by 2030 through ecommerce medium.

"Let us explore the potential of social media like Facebook, Instagram, etc., for promoting e-commerce exports," Kumar said. – PTI

HP led the personal computer (PC) market with a 30.1 per cent share despite an 8.8 per cent decline in shipments. The company's PC shipment dropped to 9.23 lakh units during the quarter from 10.12 lakh a year ago.

Dell Technologies and Acer Group's PC volume shipments market share grew 28.8 per cent each to 17.5 and 15.4 per cent, respectively.

The market shares of Lenovo and Asus declined to 15.1 and 5.9 per cent, respectively, during the reported quarter. The share of Lenovo declined 1.3 per cent to 4.64 lakh units from 4.7 lakh while

FIEO warns of dumping in India due to US-China trade war

China sitting on overcapacity in many sectors and thus threat of dumping cannot be ruled out



NEW DELHI, May 16: China has overcapacity in many sectors such as electric vehicles and hence threat of dumping of goods cannot be ruled out in the domestic market due to the escalating trade war between Beijing and Washington, exporters' body FIEO said on Thursday.

Federation of Indian Export Organisations (FIEO) President Ashwini Kumar said industry and the government should keep a close watch on the imports from China and if surge or dumping happens, the Directorate General of Trade Remedies (DGTR) should take appropriate action to safeguard businesses.

"China is sitting on overcapacity in many sectors and thus the threat of dumping cannot be ruled out and more so when an important market is closed for their exports," Kumar told report-

The US on Tuesday announced plans to slap new tariffs on Chinese electric vehicles, advanced batteries, solar cells, steel, aluminium

and medical equipment.

According to a report by think tank GTRI, the escalation of the trade war between the US and China may push Beijing to dump goods in the Indian markets.

However, Kumar added that this also provides opportunity to India and other competitors to chip in at the supply gap.

Of the products affected by additional duties on China, India has opportunities in facemasks, PPE, syringes, needles, medical gloves, aluminium and iron and steel. "Opportunity may come in China also with retaliation on US exports, provided we have market access in products targeted by China," he said.

Further, he said that the Red Sea crisis is having a significant negative impact on both sea freight and air freight, which is in turn affecting Indian exports.

As some goods traditionally shipped by sea are being diverted to air due to the crisis, there is a rise in air freight demand. This has pushed air cargo costs upwards, with

some reports suggesting a jump of over 300 per cent for routes like India to Europe, Kumar said.

"The rise in both sea and air freight costs makes Indian exports more expensive for foreign buyers. This can hurt India's competitiveness in the global market. We have lost a few orders due to high freight rates, particularly in metal and commodities," he added.

He also said that delays and higher costs can disrupt the smooth flow of Indian exports, leading to potential order cancellations and reputational damage. "Overall, the Red Sea crisis is creating a challenging situation for Indian exporters. The Indian government and businesses are looking for strategies to mitigate these impacts, such as exploring alternative shipping routes and negotiating with shipping lines," he said.

The DGTR (Directorate General of Trade Remedies) is an investigation arm of the commerce ministry that deals with anti-dumping duty, safeguard duty, and countervailing duty. – PTI

Govt slashes windfall tax on domestic crude

NEW DELHI, May 16: The government has slashed windfall tax on domestically produced crude oil to Rs 5,700 per tonne, from Rs 8,400 per tonne, with effect from Thursday. The tax is levied in the form of Special Additional Excise Duty (SAED). The SAED on the export of diesel, petrol and jet fuel or ATF, has been retained at 'nil'. The new rates are effective from May 16, an official notification said.

India first imposed windfall profit taxes on July 1, 2022, joining a host of nations that tax supernormal profits of energy companies. The tax rates are reviewed every fortnight based on average oil prices in the previous two weeks. - PTI

Share of non-fossil fuel energy to be up 50 pc

NEW DELHI, May 16: The government aims to increase the share of non-fossil fuel to 50 per cent in the country's total installed electricity generation capacity by 2030, MNRE Sec-

retary Bhupinder Singh Bhalla said. The share of non-fossil fuel-based capacity in India's installed energy generation capacity is around 42 per cent at present, the official said in a address at the World Hydrogen Summit 2024 in Rotterdam, Netherlands, on May 15, 2024. "Approximately 43 per cent of India's current installed electricity capacity is from non-fossil-fuel sources, with projections indicating a rise to 50 per cent by 2030," he said. - PTI

NEW DELHI, May 16: India will be a USD 4 trillion economy in 2024-25 and surpass Japan by early next fiscal to become the world's fourth largest economy, Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister (EAC-PM) Member Sanjeev Sanyal said on Thursday.

Sanyal further said that a 7 per cent economic growth rate will be a 'very good' growth rate for India, given various constraints, including the country's weak exports.

"So, this financial year, we will become a USD 4 trillion economy," he said at an event here.

Recently, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said that India is expected to overtake Japan and Germany to emerge as the world's third-largest economy by 2027.

Currently, in US dollar terms, India is the fifth largest economy with a size of about USD 3.7 trillion in nominal terms.

Sanyal said Japan is now just a little ahead of us at USD 4.1 trillion. "So, either very early next year or even you know this year, we will cross Japan to become the world's fourth largest economy," Sanyal

According to him, Germany is a USD 4.6 trillion economy and it is not growing, so makes it a static target. "Maybe in two years, we will go past Germany. So, I think in terms of becoming the world's third largest economy, we are reasonably now close to the target," he said.

Sanyal argued that the government should not push any fiscal move to accelerate economic growth to 8-9 per cent. "If you get it, great, but anything around 7 per cent compounded over time is a very good growth rate. We shouldn't get too excited about 9 per cent," he said.

Sanyal said compounding of growth is the single most important thing as this will generate jobs and taxes.

While the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and Fitch Ratings have estimated India's growth at 7 per cent, the International Monetary Fund (IMF), S&P Global Ratings and Morgan Stanley projected a 6.8 per cent growth rate for FY25.

"Do not get emotional about trying to hit a very high growth rate in any particular year," he emphasised.

Sanyal emphasised that there is no need to mess around with the financial system trying to support growth. "Do not mess around with your fiscal system, your monetary system, your current account and so on," he said.

Responding to a question on the internationalisation of the rupee, Sanyal said it is about converting the rupee into a hard currency. "We

only aspire over the next decade or so to become a hard currency like many of the others, we are not attempting to become the world's anchor currency," he added.

Sanyal said India's limited purpose is to convert the rupee into a hard currency over the next decade in terms of its wider usage as the currency in which people trade, in particular, the country's own trade.

"It is a currency in which other governments in the world hold their reserves in terms of being a part of the IMF SDR basket. So, that is a limited objective," he said.

In that context, Sanyal said, the government has done a few things, including an inflation rate targeting mechanism. "...So that the rupee essentially becomes a commonly used hard currency, at least commonly used for things relating to India," he said. – PTI

EC directs MHA to retain 25 coys of CAPF even after counting

NEW DELHI, May 16: The Election Commission today directed the Union Home Ministry to retain 25 companies of Central forces in Andhra Pradesh even after counting of votes on June 4 following post-poll violence in the State as it conveyed its displeasure to

the State Chief **Andhra** Secretary and the post-poll police chief over the incidents. violence

In a statement, the EC said

"without mincing any words", it directs the Chief Secretary and the Director General of Police to ensure that such violence is not repeated and all SPs are tasked with taking pre-emptive measures to avoid such a situation in future.

The poll authority had summoned Chief Secretary KS Jawahar Reddy and DGP Harish Gupta to Nirvachan Sadan here to seek "personal explanation" over the incidents of violence reported on Monday and Tuesday.

"The commission decided to direct the Ministry of Home Affairs to retain the 25 CAPF (Central Armed Police Force) companies in Andhra Pradesh for 15 days after

counting, to control any violence after declaration of results," the poll panel said.

It said the State government had requested that Central forces be retained for 15 days post counting.

Post-poll violence was reported in parts of Andhra Pradesh on Monday and Tuesday where Lok Sabha and Assembly polls were held simultaneously on Monday.

The leaders of the ruling YSRCP and Opposition TDP have levelled allegations against each other for the incidents. - PTI

Amit Shah interacts with J&K BJP leaders during Srinagar visit

SRINAGAR, May 16: Union Home Minister Amit Shah today interacted with several delegations, including BJP leaders of Jammu & Kashmir, on the first day of his two-day visit here.

Shah, who arrived this evening, is also likely to hold a security review meeting on Friday morning.

A Pahari delegation led by Mohammad Younis Khan met the minister and thanked him for granting Scheduled Tribe status to the community.

"We have come to meet the Home Minister to express our gratitude because after 50 years of struggle, we have finally obtained Scheduled Tribe status. They have fulfilled our demand, unlike other parties who only seek votes but never fulfil their promises. We will remain faithful to them as they fulfilled our demand," Khan told reporters before the delegation's meeting with Shah.

A delegation of local Sikhs also met Shah and it said it raised the demand of inclusion of the Punjabi language in syllabus of universities and reservation of seats in the Assembly for the community as granted to Kashmiri Pandits. Among the BJP leaders who met Shah were Darakhshan Andrabi, Sunil Sharma, Tarun Chugh and RS Pathania.

Though the schedule finalised for Shah's visit is limited to meeting only BJP leaders, sources said leaders of "local allies" of the party may also meet him.

Earlier in the day, Sharma,

the general secretary of the BIP's Jammu & Kashmir unit, said the Home Minister's visit to Kashmir is not political.

"The Union minister is coming to Kashmir today, but the visit is not political. The (general) elections are under way. The voter turnout (for the Srinagar Lok Sabha seat) on May 13 is a huge success of the policies of the Central government including the abrogation of Article 370.


"I think the Home Minister is coming here to review the measures from the security point of view to increase the turnout and create an atmosphere of peace. There is no political activity, but the BIP workers will meet him and discuss the party's organisational matters," Sharma said. Asked whether a Jamaat-e-Islami delegation will meet Shah, he said no such delegation is scheduled to meet the Home Minister.

Any non-political or senior people can meet Shah but no political delegation is meeting him, Sharma said.

Shah is likely to be briefed about the security situation in Jammu & Kashmir by the top security brass as the Lok Sabha elections will be followed by the annual Amarnath Yatra, which is scheduled to start on June 29 and conclude on August 19.

The Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir might witness Assembly elections after the yatra as the Supreme Court has given a deadline of September 30 to the Centre for holding these polls. - PTI

Poll officials check CM Shinde's luggage in Nashik

ficials today checked the luggage of Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde on his arrival at a helipad in Nashik, days after Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut alleged that the CM carried bags stashed with cash in a helicopter.

The officials did not find anything objectionable in Shinde's bags. "I carry this much luggage. It contains my clothes. I have brought bags even today," Shinde told reporters when asked about his bags being checked.

Shinde was in Nashik to

seek support for incumbent MP Hemant Godse who has been renominated by Shiv Sena. He also took part in a

motorcycle rally in the city.

Raut on Monday had alleged that Shinde carried bags stuffed with cash in a helicopter to Nashik. He had posted a video on X, showing Shinde alighting from a helicopter and some persons around him carrying large bags.

"If they claim to have the support of the people, then why do they need money to entice voters," Raut had asked during a media interaction.

"The authorities have time

to probe our helicopters, but no action is taken against these people," he had added.

> After nothing suspicious was found in his bags today, Shinde also said, "Some people work secretly. Eknath Shinde works openly. Now, what went outside from the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation standing committee will also come to the fore (referring to alleged corruption in BMC)," he added.

Meanwhile, members of Sena (UBT) shouted slogans and showed their party symbol 'flaming torch' at Marathon Chowk on Gangapur passing through the area. Shinde responded by making a gesture of 'bow and arrow',

the Shiv Sena's symbol. This prompted the authorities to step up security at the Sena (UBT) office in the Shalimar Chowk area to avoid a confrontation between the rival Senas when the rally passed from there.

Nashik is among the 13 Lok Sabha seats that will go to polls in the fifth phase on May 20, marking the conclusion of general elections in Maharashtra. Votes will be counted on June 4. - PTI

RANCHI, May 16: Jharkhand minister Alamgir Alam, who was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate in connection with its probe into a money laundering case, was today remanded to the custody of the Central agency for six days by a special PMLA court here, lawyers said. The ED sought a 10-day remand for Alam.

Alam's lawyer Kishlay

Prasad said that his six-day remand will start on Friday. "Today, he is in judicial custody. There is no specific allegation against Alam. Everything is vague. Neither they are disclosing the name of the person who has taken money or who has taken proceeds of crime. There is no direct involvement of the minister. Cash was recovered from one Jahangir who has no link with Alamgir Alam," Prasad said. Alam's counsel also cited the health condition of the 70year-old minister in the court, while opposing the ED's re-

mand plea. "He has been suffering from sleep apnea, due to which his oxygen level reduces during the night. Therefore, he needs oxygen support. Such support was even provided by the family of Alam during ED custody

The State Parliamentary Affairs Minister represents the Pakur seat in the Jharkhand Assembly.

He came under the ED radar following the recent arrest of his personal secretary and State Administrative Service officer Sanjeev Kumar Lal (52) and the latter's domestic help Jahangir Alam (42). The Central agency recovered more than Rs 32 crore in cash from a flat linked to them during a raid on May 6. - PTI



Lightning strikes kill 11 in Bengal's Malda

MALDA (WB), May 16: At least 11 people were killed this afternoon after being struck by lightning in different places across Malda district of West Bengal, a

government official said. The district administration has announced a compensation of Rs 2 lakh each for the families of the deceased, he said.

"So far, 11 people have been killed due to lightning strikes. A number of injured

people are being treated at various hospitals. Some of the injured are in critical condition," the official told PTI.

orchard, he said.

hammed Tola and a couple, Nayan Roy (23) and Priyanka Singha (20) of Harishchandrapur, also lost their lives due to lightning, the official added.

In Haddatola, lightning killed Atul Mandal (65) and Sheikh Sabrul (11) while Sumitra Mandal (45) lost her life in Mirdadpur, he said.

In Englishbazar's Milki, a man identified as Pankaj Mandal (23) was killed. - PTI

Slovakian PM Fico remains Violence rages in New Caledonia in 'serious' condition

BRATISLAVA, May 16: The condition icopter after the shooting attack that folice in the past and therefore had a fireof Slovakian Prime Minister Robert Fico is "still serious" following the assassination attempt a day ago, Defence Minister Robert Kalinak said on Thursday after a special meeting of the Security Council in Bratislava.

Kalinak, who is also the Deputy Prime Minister, said that Fico had been hit by four bullets and they had caused serious injuries. "The doctors have managed to stabilize his condition," he said, but stressed Fico is not yet out of danger. "We have had a difficult night," Kalinak said.

Miriam Lapunikova, director of the FD Roosevelt Hospital in Banska Bystrica, said Fico underwent a five-hour emergency operation on Wednesday evening.

Two teams of doctors were involved in the operation, and Fico continues to be under the constant care of a team of doctors, she said.

Fico, 59, was flown to hospital by hel-

lowed a government meeting in the central town of Handlova.

The suspected shooter, who was arrested at the scene, is a 71-year-old man



from the town of Levice, according to Interior Minister Matus Sutaj Estok. Initial questioning had revealed a "clear political motive," according to the minister.

According to media reports, the man had worked for a private security servarms licence.

The attack occurred as Fico, a left-wing nationalist, went outside to shake hands after a Cabinet meeting held at the House of Culture in Handlová. One of the shots hit him in the abdomen.

The local television station RTV Prievidza published a video of the incident showing a man pushing against the fence and shooting at the prime minister from close range.

Experts in Slovakia criticized the security precautions surrounding Fico's outing. "Fico himself spoke a few weeks ago about the danger of someone shooting at politicians," former Slovakian police chief Stefan Hamran told the Dennik N newspaper on Thursday.

He also criticised the reaction of security staff after the shots were fired. "There was chaos there, that is obvious and that is a failure." - IANS

New Caledonia for the third consecutive day on Thursday, hours after France imposed a state of emergency in the French Pacific territory, boosting security forces' powers to quell deadly unrest in the archipelago that has long sought independence.

French authorities in New Caledonia and the interior ministry in Paris reported that five people, including two police officer, have been killed in the violence after protests earlier this week over voting reforms pushed by President Emmanuel Macron's government turned deadly.

At least 60 members of the security forces were injured and 214 people were arrested in the Thursday's clashes with police, arson and looting, according to the territory's top French official, High Commissioner Louis Le Franc.

"Everything is being done to restore order and calm that Caledonians deserve. French Prime Minister Gabriel Attal said after Thursday's security meeting at the Elysee presidential palace in Paris.

Attal said France will provide the island with essential goods after three days of unrest. In addition to the 1,700 security forces troops that have already been deployed to help police curb the violence, 1,000 more are on the way, he added.

The situation "remains very tense, with looting, riots, arson and attacks which are unbearable and unspeakable," Attal said. Two members of the island's Indigenous Kanak community were among the five dead, French Interior and

PARIS, May 16: Violence raged across Overseas Territories Minister Gerald ister Gabriel Attal said Wednesday. Darmanin said on Thursday.

"The (French) state will regain total control," Darmanin declared in a series

of interviews with French media. Darmanin said 10 people, all alleged members of the pro-independence movement known as The Field Acton Coordination Unit, have been placed under house arrest. In April, the group had backed several protests against French authorities on the island.

However, Darmanin, the interior minister, alleged on Thursday that the movement is a "small group which calls itself pro-independence, but instead commits looting, murder and violence". "We will not back down," Darmanin said.

The National Council of Chiefs of the Indigenous Kanak people condemned "all acts of vandalism and gun violence" as "unjustifiable", but rejected the allegations that members of The Field Action Coordination Unit have been involved in the deadly violence.

Grand Chief Hippolyte Sinewami-Htamumu expressed full support for the proindependence group, which has mobilised more than a hundred thousand people "of all ages and from all backgrounds" in peaceful protests in recent months in the capital, Nouméa, and throughout the island.

"This is not a terrorist group' or mafia group,' as certain political leaders want us to believe," he said in a statement on Thursday.

The state of emergency will be in place for at least 12 days, French Prime Min-

French military forces were being deployed to protect ports and airports and to beef up security forces' efforts to curb violence. The curfew has been extended until Friday morning, Le Franc said. The territory's political parties appealed for calm and reason with people who support independence and those who want the island to remain part of France in a joint statement.

The last time France imposed such measures on one of its overseas territories was in 1985, also in New Caledonia.

The emergency powers enable French and local authorities on the archipelago to tackle unrest, namely by authorising the house detention for people deemed a threat to public order and expanding powers to conduct searches, seize weapons and restrict movements, with possible jail time for violators.

The Pacific island east of Australia. home to about 270,000 people and 10 time zones ahead of Paris, is known to tourists for its UNESCO World Heritage atolls and reefs. Tensions have simmered for decades between the Indigenous Kanaks seeking independence and colonisers' descendants who want it to remain part of France.

People of European descent in New Caledonia, which has long served as France's prison colony and now has a French military base, distinguish between descendants of colonizers and descendants of the many prisoners sent to the territory by force. - AP

5 Israeli soldiers killed in Gaza

JERUSALEM, May 16: Five Israeli soldiers were killed and seven others injured, three of them seriously, by errant Israeli tank fire in the Jabalia refugee camp in the northern Gaza Strip, the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) said in a statement on Thursday.

The casualties were with a force that entered Gaza City and seized buildings as part of a resumed attack on the refugee camp, Xinhua news agency reported.

Two IDF tanks, positioned several dozen meters away, apparently spotted a gun in a window of one of the buildings and fired two shells towards the target. The army said it was investigating why the soldiers were misidentified as Palestinian militants.

A total of 626 soldiers have been killed in Hamas' Oct. 7 attack and Israel's ensuing attacks on Gaza, according to the IDF tally. – IANS

3 dead after small plane crashes

FRANKLIN (US), May 16: Three people are dead after a small plane crashed on Wednesday in Williamson County, local officials confirmed.

Williamson County Chief Deputy Mark Elrod told reporters that the plane had left Baton Rouge, Louisiana, and was headed to Louisville, Kentucky, but crashed in Tennessee near Leiper's Fork, about 30 miles (48.28 kilometers) south of Nashville, around noon local time. "It does appear that the plane did break up in the air," Elrod said.

Elrod added that the debris field is more than a mile long, but no structures have been reported damaged.

The names of the victims have not been released.

Jill Burgin, spokesperson for the Williamson County Emergency Management Agency, said they received a 911 call at about 12:05 pm.

"He just said a possible plane crash, but he didn't have a lot of details," Burgin told reporters. - AP

Sri Lanka to send high-level team to Moscow

COLOMBO, May 16: Sri Lanka on Thursday said it will send a high-level delegation to Russia to look into the issue of its retired soldiers joining the Russian military at the Ukrainian war front. The development comes a day after the Sri Lankan Defence Ministry admitted at least 16 retired military personnel have been killed in the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war.

"President Ranil Wickremesinghe has instructed to send a team comprising the Defence Secretary, a Foreign Ministry official and a former Sri Lankan diplomat to Russia to look into the Sri Lankans who have joined the Russian military in the Ukrainian war front,' State Minister of Foreign Affairs Tharaka Balasuriya was quoted as saying by news portal Adaderana.Lk.

An emergency hotline number of the Ministry of Defence is currently in operation to collect the information of Sri Lankan nationals, who have travelled to Russia to join the war, Balasuriya told a press briefing.

On Wednesday, State Minister for Defence Premitha Bandara Tennakoon said that 16 Sri Lankan retired military personnel have been killed in the Russia-Ukraine war.

The Sri Lankan mercenaries had joined the Russian and Ukrainian forces after unscrupulous foreign employment agencies misled them in the name of foreign employment, according to police. Tennakoon had said that plans are being made to bring back Sri Lankans who are currently in Russia and Ukraine.

"The figure according to the information received so far is 288," Tennakoon said, adding, "The government would take action to bring them back as complaints have been received from their relatives.'

Tennakoon also hinted that it was a human trafficking operation where former servicemen go through a third country to reach the war front and said, last week, Sri Lanka had opened an inquiry into the recruitment of its citizens for the conflict. - PTI

Australian unemployment rate rises to 4.1 per cent

CANBERRA, May 16: Australia's unemployment rate rose for a second straight month to 4.1 per cent in April. According to official fig-

ures released by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) on Thursday, the unemployment rate rose from 3.9 percent in March to 4.1 per cent in April – the equal-highest rate since January 2022, Xinhua news agen-

cy reported. The rise in the unemployment rate came despite the number of employed Australians increasing by 38,500 people between March and April, with a 44,600 rise in part-time positions partially offset by a 6,100 fall in full-time roles.

In the same period, the

number of unemployed people – meaning those who are not employed but are actively looking for work – rose by 30,300 to 604,200.

The participation rate, which measures the proportion of the working-age population who are either employed or looking for work, rose slightly to 66.7 percent in April from 66.6 per cent in March.

"The employment-to-population ratio remained steady at 64.0 per cent in April, indicating that recent employment growth is broadly keeping pace with population

growth," Bjorn Jarvis, head of labor statistics at the ABS, said in

a media release. "This suggests that the labour market remains tight, though less

tight than late 2022 and early 2023." The total number of hours worked by Aus-

tralians was 1.96 billion in April – 15 million fewer than in April 2023.

The federal budget handed down by Treasurer Jim Chalmers on Tuesday projected that unemployment would rise to 4.25 per cent by June 2024 and to 4.5 per cent by June 2025. – IANS

Sudan denies reports of visa denial to US envoy

KHARTOUM, May 16: Sudan's Foreign Ministry on Thursday issued a statement refuting claims that the Sudanese government had declined to grant an entry visa to U.S. Special Envoy for Sudan, Tom Perriello.

The ministry clarified, "The Sudanese Embassy in Washington or any other capital did not receive a request from Perriello for an entry visa," Xinhua News Agency reported.

Earlier reports from Sudanese local media suggested that Perriello had stated during a meeting with a Sudanese civil group in Kampala, Uganda, that the Sudanese government had denied

Responding to these reports, the Sudanese Foreign Ministry confirmed that the Sudanese embassy in Washington contacted the U.S. State Department, which affirmed that Perriello had not made such statements.

Perriello was appointed as the US special envoy for Sudan on Feb. 26, 2024, with a mandate to lead US efforts to resolve the ongoing armed conflict in Sudan. Facebook, Instagram face fresh scrutiny under EU's digital regulations

LONDON, May 16: The European Union opened fresh investigations on Thursday into Facebook and Instagram over suspicions that they're failing to protect children online, in violation of the bloc's strict digital regulations for social media platforms.

It's the latest round of scrutiny for parent company Meta Platforms under the 27nation EU's Digital Services Act, a sweeping set of regulations that took effect last year with the goal of cleaning up online platforms and protecting internet users.

sion, the bloc's executive

the algorithmic systems used by Facebook and Instagram to recommend content like videos and posts could "exploit the weaknesses and inexperience" of children and stimulate "addictive behaviour". It's worried that these systems could reinforce the socalled "rabbit hole" effect that leads users to increasingly disturbing content.

The commission is also looking into Meta's use of age verification tools to prevent children from accessing Facebook or Instagram, or be shown inappropriate content. Only children aged 13 and

older are allowed to use the platforms. It's also looking into whether the company is complying with DSA rules requiring a high level of privacy, safety and security for minors.

"We want young people to have safe, age-appropriate experiences online and have spent a decade developing more than 50 tools and policies designed to protect them," Meta said in a prepared statement. "This is a challenge the whole industry is facing, and we look forward to sharing details of our work with the European Commission.

cases to focus on child protection under the DSA, which requires platforms to put in place stringent measures to protect minors. The commission opened two separate investigations earlier this year into TikTok over concerns about risks to kids. "We are not convinced that

Meta has done enough to comply with the DSA obligations - to mitigate the risks of negative effects to the physical and mental health of young Europeans on its platforms Facebook and Instagram," European Commissioner Thierry Breton said in a social media post.

The cases announced Thursday aren't the first for Facebook and Instagram. They're are already being investigated under the DSA over concerns they're not doing enough to stop foreign disinformation ahead of EU elections next month.

Social media platform X and e-commerce site AliExpress are also being investigated over their compliance with the EU rules.

There's no deadline for the investigations to wrap up. Violations could result in fines of up to 6% of a company's annual worldwide revenue. - AP

I am very confident that whatever he decides to do after football will have an immense impact on society in a very positive way. He was born to become a GOAT (Greatest Of All Time).'

Stalwart Chhetri announces retirement, WC qualifier on June 6 to be his last game

NEW DELHI, May 16: The iconic Sunil Chhetri on Thursday announced his decision to retire from international football after the FIFA World Cup qualifying match against Kuwait on June 6, bringing the curtains down on a career that is unparalleled in Indian football for its longevity and consistency.

The long-serving national team captain who always mentioned playing for India has been 'intense joy', announced his decision via a video he posted on his social media accounts.

Chhetri, who made his debut in 2005, has scored 94 goals for the country. He will leave the scene as India's all-time top scorer and most-capped player.

He is also third in the list of goal scorers among active players behind Cristiano Ronaldo and Lionel Messi and currently sits as the fourth in the all-time list of international goal-scorers as well.

Chhetri, 39, will walk into international sunset after rendering yeoman service for nearly two decades, 19 years to be precise, to a team that was heavily reliant on the 5'7" forward to deliver the goods every time he wore the blue jersey.

"The match Against Kuwait is the last," Chhetri said while announcing his

Chhetri's final match will be played at the Salt Lake Stadium in Kolkata, and it is appropriate that he will end his journey in a city, where he has played a lot of his football while evolving into a potent striker.

Chhetri had made his 150th national appearance in March and scored on the occasion against Afghanistan in Guwahati. India, though, stunningly lost that
